



Father Mike's Message

God's Gift of the Spirit!!!

Today is a day of great jubilation for the life of the Church. Pentecost culminates our fifty-day celebration of the Easter mystery. The first Sunday's of Easter concentrated on the risen Jesus whereas the last Sundays transfer the focus from Jesus to us as his disciples. All that Jesus was and did, the Spirit empowers us to become and do.

The Old Testament speaks of a festival of the first fruits of grain called harvest or festival of weeks. It took place seven weeks, or 50 days after Passover. Pentecost is actually a Greek word for the "Festival of Weeks," and means "50." This festival commemorated and celebrated the end of the grain harvest when the Jews offered the "first fruits" to God. For a long time this feast became a pilgrimage festival as devout Jews walked to the temple in Jerusalem50 days after Passover. In Jewish tradition this feast remembered the covenant to Moses on Mount Sinai when Israel accepted the call to be God's people. Now, Pentecost becomes the time in which a new people are formed in a new covenant made at the Last Supper. This new people is born out of a new exodus, from spiritual slavery which is sin to the promised land of grace. This newly formed people were to have a mission to the whole world, symbolized by all of the languages and peoples who were assembled at that first Christian Pentecost.

In this Pentecost gospel Jesus speaks to his disciples about the relationship of love and commandment. In fact, we are able to love and keep commandment because we have been given the Spirit. The Spirit's dwelling within us is the Father's and Jesus' love and precondition for why we continue Jesus' mission. The Spirit is the power planted within us to remember and ultimately to fulfill the mission Jesus entrusted to us. The risen life of Jesus is shared with us in a most profound way through the coming of the Spirit. We ourselves now go forth to carry on Jesus' mission, equipped with divine indwelling. We are never alone in our demanding discipleship; the Spirit is always with us.

The Spirit is received in baptism and the Spirit's presence is strengthened in confirmation so that we might carry on Jesus' saving mission. Pentecost becomes a harvest of people rather than of grains and fruits, and brings together the many gifts of varied cultures and languages and forges them into one people of God. Sometimes in our lives we might witness to a powerful presence of the Spirit. Perhaps we must confront another who has done wrong and refuses to change, stand up to injustice, or challenge another to more ethical and generous living. Sometimes in our lives we might witness to a gentler, relational Spirit. Perhaps we spend extra time with the children, or visit an elderly relative or help someone in need. In all of these great and simple acts the Spirit works through us and makes Jesus' saving mission present.

Saint Gertrude and Christ the King Parishes, and Saint Gertrude and Saint Catherine Cemeteries are seeking a Facilities Manager (FM). The FM will be supervised by the Pastor. The FM's responsibilities will include, but are not limited to, overseeing all aspects of a building's operations, including maintenance, repairs, security, cleaning, and utilities; coordinating with contractors; supervising facilities staff and volunteers; scheduling preventive maintenance; addressing all facility related issues to maintaining a functional and efficient work environment by being compliant with regulations, and managing day-to-day operations, including interactions with tenants.

The FM will be responsible for routine checks and maintenance of all buildings and grounds at all of the aforementioned entities. The FM will oversee and coordinate grass cutting, snow removal and grounds maintenance. The FM will perform custodial work as necessary. If not actually licensed to do so, the FM will have a general knowledge of HVAC systems, electrical, plumbing, and carpentry. The FM will supervise and direct possible part time employees and/or contractors and/or volunteers.

The FM will oversee cemetery operations which include, but are not limited to, overall cemetery grounds maintenance; arrange for footer, head stone, and plaque installations; grave management, which includes being able to coordinate with office personnel and funeral directors, arrange for the excavating and back filling of graves, arrange for the opening and closing of mausoleums; arrange for the opening and closing of the chapels for services, direct funeral processions, and accurately record and file paperwork; arrange for grass cutting and snow removal; schedule contractors; possibly assist grieving families and other inquires.

Applicants MUST have good communication skills, be self-motivated, be computer savvy, have a valid driver's license, be reliable and be conscientious. Although being Catholic is not necessary for employment, applicants should have an understanding and appreciation of the Catholic faith and its rituals. Applicants are reminded that, if hired, they will be employees of the Roman Catholic Diocese of Greensburg. Before starting employment applicants are REQUIRED to undergo and successfully complete all necessary trainings and obtain all necessary clearances to comply with the Diocese of Greensburg's call to Higher Standards, which include, but may not be limited to, background checks and fingerprinting. The Diocese of Greensburg is an equal opportunity employer. Salary is negotiable based on knowledge, expertise and skill set.
