Peace and blessings to you all!



# **Our Shepherds**

#### His Holiness Pope Leo XIV, Supreme Pontiff of the Universal Church

Pope Leo XIV, elected in 2025 as the first American pope, hails from Chicago. Before his election, he was Cardinal Robert Prevost. Known for his pastoral heart, theological clarity, and commitment to evangelization, Pope Leo brings a renewed focus to the vital role of the parish in the life of the universal Church. Pope Leo spent more than two decades in Peru, where he became a naturalized citizen and served as a missionary and bishop. He is fluent in English, Spanish, Italian, French, and Portuguese, and also reads Latin and German.



### The Most Reverend Larry J. Kulick, JCL, Bishop of Greensburg

Bishop Larry J. Kulick, J.C.L., is the sixth Bishop of Greensburg, having been appointed by Pope Francis on December 18, 2020, and consecrated on February 11, 2021. He is the first native Bishop of the Diocese, hailing from Leechburg. His episcopal motto is Christus est veritas ("Christ is the truth"), reflecting his deep devotion to truth rooted in the Gospel. He is steadfastly committed to strengthening and nurturing our parishes, ensuring they remain vibrant centers of faith and service for generations to come.



Father James B. Morley, a native of Latrobe, was ordained in June 2015 by Bishop Lawrence E. Brandt. He has served as Parochial Vicar and Pastor in numerous parishes throughout the Diocese, as well as Vicar Forane (Dean) of Deanery IV. He was installed as Pastor of Saint Elizabeth Ann Seton Parish and Immaculate Conception Parish, Irwin, in July 2025. He is deeply dedicated to fostering and enriching the spiritual and prayer life of the parish community by guiding the faithful toward a closer union with Christ through prayer and devotion.



## Father Louiegene Arnold Valdez, Parochial Vicar

Father Louiegene Arnold Valdez, a native of the Diocese of Bangued in the Philippines, has been serving the Diocese of Greensburg since his appointment as Parochial Vicar August 31, 2023. He faithfully ministers to the communities of Saint Elizabeth Ann Seton Parish and Immaculate Conception Parish in Irwin, bringing pastoral care and international missionary experience to his parish assignments. In addition to celebrating Masses, he collaborates with parish staff in sacramental preparation, spiritual formation, and outreach efforts across the Norwin Catholic community.

## **Father Vijay Kumar, Parochial Vicar**

Father Vijay Kumar serves as a Parochial Vicar at Saint Elizabeth Ann Seton Parish and Immaculate Conception Parish in Irwin. He is a member of the Heralds of Good News Society, an international missionary congregation. Before his assignment in the Diocese of Greensburg, he served in various pastoral roles in India, contributing to the Church's mission through evangelization, education, and community service.

The Saint Vincent de Paul Food Bank is hosted at Saint Elizabeth Ann Seton Parish, providing monthly distribution of food to our community members in need. We also offer a ministry of homebound visits for parishioners in need and a summer lunch Totes for Kids program for kids in need that is run by parish volunteers. In addition to these special outreach programs, we have an annual parish picnic and Lenten fish fries as well as summer Vacation Bible School for ages pre-K through sixth grade.

We also participate in Camp Virtue, a weeklong day camp that allows sixth- to eighth-graders from our parish the opportunity to explore their Catholic faith and the natural world around them. Camp Virtue helps participants understand that they can enjoy each day to the fullest while being filled with faith and a love for God.
