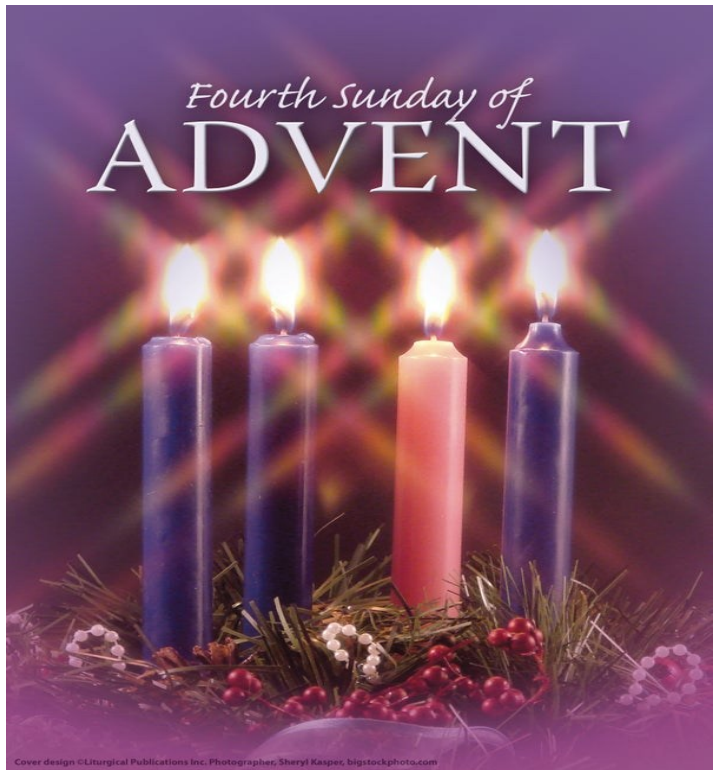

## Words of Faith from Father Jim

One of the recent areas in which the Holy Spirit has helped me to grow is in practicing mental prayer during my daily Holy Hour. The greatest resource we have in this life is our time, and that means the greatest gift I can offer God is my time. Making a daily Holy Hour says to the Lord, *You are worth my time*, no matter what joys or sufferings have been part of the day. It also says, "I trust You, Lord." Many people—myself included—can get stuck wondering what to do during a Holy Hour: *Should I pray the Rosary? Read Scripture? Read my current spiritual book?* All of that is good. As priests, we often pray part of the Liturgy of the Hours (the Divine Office) during our daily Holy Hour, and I have loved all of this for some time now. However, I can honestly say that contemplation, or mental prayer, has always been the more difficult aspect of prayer for me to make a habit.

Last week, in the silence of my Holy Hour, I felt prompted to set aside my usual routine. Instead, I became still, bowed my head in silence, closed my eyes, and imagined a place where I could meet the Lord Jesus, Mary, and Joseph and simply sit with them for a while. It was something like the top of a hill, with an open doorway. A bright and joyful Blessed Mother Mary took my hand when I reached out for help entering this space and led me into this place of safety.

I trembled as I embraced the truth of her pure goodness and felt no sense of needing to say anything at all. Together, we looked at my day as if it were laid out on a table before us. I entered more deeply into my imagination...and I was able to let go of my will and rest in our Lord's in this space.

The biggest false roadblock for people practicing mental prayer is the belief that they must know the *correct* images of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph to think about. The good news is that God has not given us exact images we are supposed to imagine—we only have images from those prayerful people who have contemplated them before us. Why has God made it this way? ---So that we may imagine Him, Joseph, and Mary freely. He knows we need this, and He delights in our holy imagination. *That* is mental prayer.

God has given us the ingredients, yes—but He leaves the contemplation to us, His children. This Advent, allow yourself to enter the silence and contemplate the Holy Family. Create your own mental prayer space and look at your life together with Jesus, Mary, and Joseph. Hear His heartbeat next to yours, and allow their (The Holy Family's) gentleness toward you to be received. And then... just stay there for a while.

The sacrament is available during Confession hour and after each Mass.

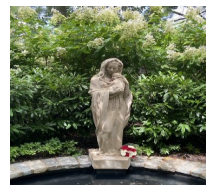
#### **Matrimony**

We ask that you take ONE kit per home and donate at least \$1.00 to pay for the supplies. The kits have been blessed and included within the lit are the instruction sheet, chalk and holy water. The family will use the chalk to write the following above the doorway.**

**20 + C + M + B + 26**

**The letters represent the first initials of the three kings who visited the Christ child on the Epiphany: Casper, Melchior, and Balthazar. Those letters also signify the Latin phrase *Christus Manionem benedicat*, which means, “May Christ bless this House”.**

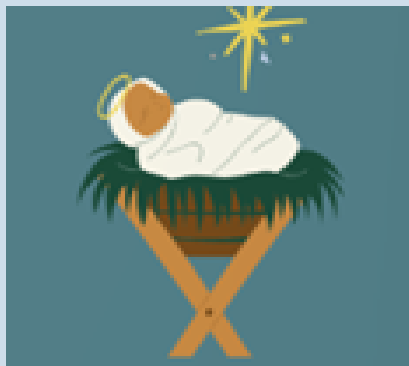
