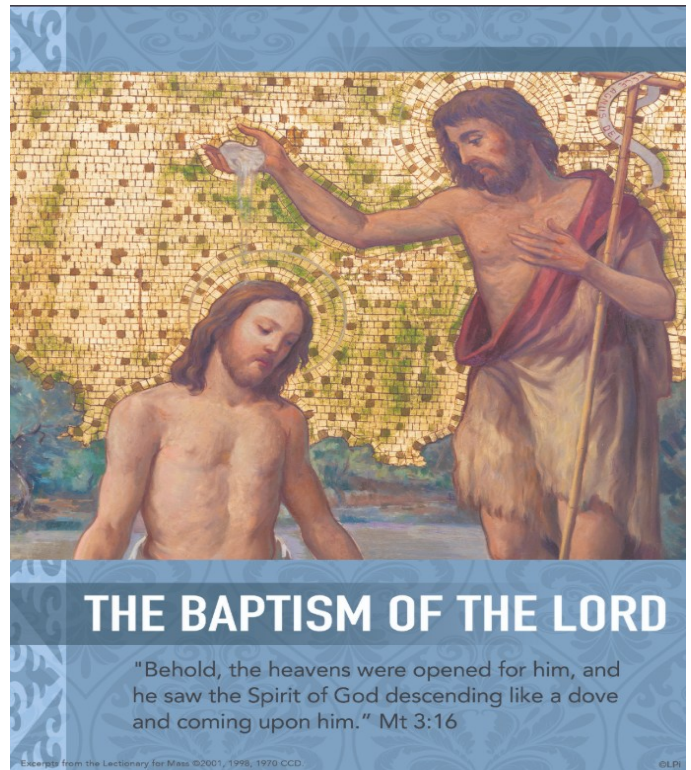

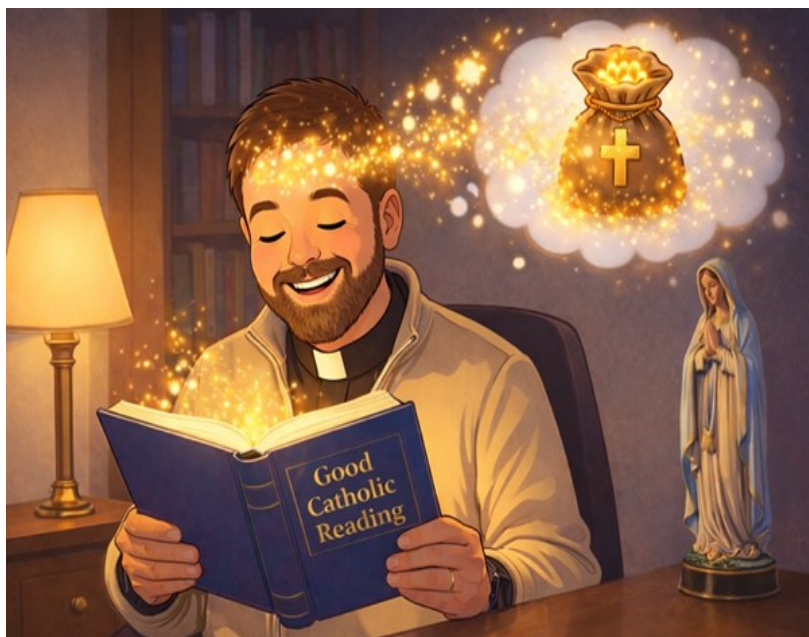

Words of Faith from Father Jim

Good Catholic reading every day. --I admit that I have never been a “reader.” (Outside of my prayer books) Throughout most of my life, I read books that I *had* too for education requirements and to learn what I needed too. I looked at books as this heavy task of homework...and I always had this tension thinking...” I’m never going to remember all of that! A number of years ago, I realized something; A good Catholic book is not something I am supposed to memorize....it's a treasure chest. (and) each book that is of value contains within it a certain amount of treasures. A *book treasure* is an insight, a clarity, or a new thing that I didn’t know before that causes me joy to learn! These are priceless!

Some books may only have 5-10 treasures in them. Others may have a treasure on every page! Don't let these awesome treasures go undiscovered by you! When you read a book (especially a book about your faith) remember that you are looking for these *treasures*. Write *only the treasures down* when you find them. Develop this skill! This is how you properly read a book; by actively searching for treasures. With this method, you will naturally pay more attention and you will let go of any anxiety you have about forgetting all the “filler words.” You only need to remember the treasures! This understanding helped me to begin **wanting** to read books on my own time for my spiritual improvement outside of my ordinary prayer times! Trust me, it works! Good luck on your next treasure hunt! A priest friend of mine once said, "One sure way to keep the fire of the Holy Spirit burning in your heart is to always be doing some good Catholic reading every day in addition to your prayer life!"

Full time manager will oversee cemetery operations which include, but are not limited to, overall cemetery grounds maintenance; arrange for footer, head stone, and plaque installations; grave management, which includes being able to coordinate with office personnel and funeral directors, excavating and back filling of graves, opening and closing of graves; opening and closing of the chapels for services, direct funeral processions, and accurately record and file paperwork; grass cutting at cemetery and snow removal at all parish and cemetery grounds; schedule contractors when necessary, and other inquiries. Applicants MUST have a mechanical background, good communication skills, have a valid driver's license, be reliable and be conscientious. Although being Catholic is not necessary for employment, applicants should have an understanding and appreciation of the Catholic faith and its rituals. Applicants are reminded that, if hired, will be employees of the Roman Catholic Diocese of Greensburg. Before starting employment, applicants are REQUIRED to undergo and successfully complete all necessary trainings and obtain all necessary clearances to comply with the Diocese of Greensburg's call to Higher Standards, which include, but may not be limited to, background checks and fingerprinting.
